

The Kentucky Society of Certified Public Managers® (KSCPM) held its summer luncheon July 12 on the campus of Eastern Kentucky University in Richmond. KSCPM members at the Department of Criminal Justice Training were the hosts for this annual event. Guest speaker Commissioner Alex Payne spoke about how the leadership in an organization can motivate, facilitate communication and evaluate the results of a team project.
