The Gene W. Childress Leadership Award was presented to JoJuana Leavell-Greene at the Kentucky Society of Certified Public Managers<sup>®</sup> Election and Awards Luncheon in Frankfort.

This award is given in honor of Gene Childress who served as the first Executive Director of the Governmental Services Center beginning in 1981 and instituted a training program that later became affiliated with the Certified Public Manager® Consortium. Because of Childress' history with and support of Kentucky Certified Public the Managers<sup>®</sup> program, the Gene W. Childress Leadership Award was created to honor like-minded individuals. This prestigious award recognizes outstanding leadership in

government. A Society committee selects the winner through an evaluation of applications.

The 2016 recipient of the award is a person who exemplifies outstanding leadership. JoJuana Leavell-Greene is truly an outstanding leader in many areas. She is a graduate from Kentucky State University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Accounting. Major Jude Speaks at Summer Luncheon



KSCPM held its annual summer luncheon at the Department of Criminal Justice Training (DOCJT) Center on June 28, 2017. Major David P. Jude, with the Kentucky State Police (KSP), was the guest speaker and provided insight of how lessons learned on a tennis court can be applied to leadership in our day-to-day life. Major Jude has held many leadership roles inside and outside of KSP to include head coach for the Bourbon County Girls Tennis Team. He explained that motivating even the "sweetest" of people can be a challenge.

Jude's lessons in leadership can certainly be applied to all aspects of our daily lives. It is imperative that we first "have a plan" in order to be prepared for what may come. This includes developing our critical thinking skills, building confidence, and being prepared to face obstacles. Jude stated that it all starts with "working on the fundamentals" or "realizing that we don't have to be an expert to be a winner; we just have to be fundamentally strong." He explained that we must "be fearless" so that we have the strength to stand alone. We must become confident with failure so that we can become confident in success. When crafting a plan or vision, others may not be able to clearly understand what you imagine. It is then necessary to be "focused" in order to stay true to the plan. Jude went on to say that it is easy to lose focus even when experiencing success. However, it is imperative that we continue to focus on the moment or this point in time. We must also be willing to "attack" or openly defend the plan. It is vital that we show our commitment and stand up and support the vision. Jude explained that timing is everything and that often we must create opportunities to create wins. We must concentrate on our "footwork", standing strong when needed, and being ready to move to create new opportunities. Jude clarified that in all that we do, we must remember to remain "patient" and yet persistent. We can shape and guide the process, but we

# Inaugural CPM Program relaunches and CPM Program goes global

In 2016, The University of Georgia's Carl Vinson Institute of Government relaunched the Certified Public Manager® program to strengthen leadership skills for local and state government managers in Georgia. The Carl Vinson Institute of Government is a Public Service and Outreach unit of the University of Georgia that conducts training, technical assistance and applied research to help state and local governments operate efficiently and provide improved service to the public.

The idea for the CPM began in the early 1970s at the University of Georgia with the realization that the state was experiencing explosive growth in information and knowledge, significant new social legislation, and rapidly altering social values. During this time, the Institute of Government and the Georgia Merit System were offering management training to public employees. It was recognized that these two organizations were offering duplications of training in some areas of management and were failing to meet the needs of other management areas. In 1974 University of Georgia's Institute of Government, the Georgia Center for Continuing Education, and the Georgia State Merit System for Personnel Administration convened to discuss ways to broaden and refine Georgia state management training programs to meet the challenges of rapid change in the state and society. A consensus was reached that management in state government needed to become more professional.

Ken Henning is considered the father of the CPM. He observed that most state training programs consisted of separate courses in which content was varied and lacked consistent focus. Henning felt that an integrated program would achieve a more organized approach to competencies needed by management

#### The CUTTING EDGE

On February 9, 1976, the Georgia House of Representatives passed Resolution Act No. 97 in response to Governor Busbee's request, authorizing and directing the State Personnel Board and the State Merit System of Personnel Administration to implement the Certified Public Manager® Program in the State Government of Georgia. On February 19, 1976, the Senate adopted the resolution and the legislature unanimously passed the resolution on February 26, 1976. On March 1, 1976, the CPM was formally established.

In 2010, CPM began the first stage of international expansion by creating a CPM credential program for the Swedish National Defense College. The program would provide training for faculty, staff, and students in Sweden and the opportunity to attain CPM designation. The contract for the CPM program at the Swedish National Defense College was signed, along with the William P. Hobby Center for Public Service which is affiliated with Texas State University - San Marcos and the National CPM Consortium. The program in Sweden is viewed as the first step toward more international expansion of the CPM.

In 2015, Leiden University Centre for Professional Learning in the Netherlands was the first international program to become a member of the National Certified Public Manager<sup>®</sup> Consortium and be granted Associate status. Associate status grants authorization to develop an Accredited Certified Public Manager<sup>®</sup> Program. Leiden intends to develop a pilot multi-country program serving the European Union.
