

KSCPM Board Meeting Minutes February 8, 2011 Division of Securities Conference Room 1025 Capital Center Drive, Frankfort, KY 11:30 A.M. – 12:40 P.M.

Jennifer Woods, President, called the meeting to order at 11:30 A.M.

Attending: Katy Cave, Cassidy Connell, Gregory Giesler, Robinil Jameson, Lynn Keeling, Margaret Puckett, and Larry Totten

Absent: Carmen Bishop and Ande Godsey

Minutes: The minutes were passed out and Katy Cave made a motion to accept the minutes as presented, and Gregory Giesler seconded. The minutes of the December 7 meeting were accepted as presented.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer, Larry Totten, passed out the Financial statement as of February 8, 2011. Revenue total is \$1,240.83 and Expense total is 797.23. The

budgeted revenue is \$6,860.00, and budgeted expenses are \$6,600.00, which does not include the \$2,000 budgeted for delegates/officers to attend the AACPM conference, that has not been used for the past two years. Interest rates have improved by a modest amount from .95 to 1.4%. The AACPM assessment has been paid and the dues must be paid in March.

Committee Reports:

Membership: We currently have 57 paid members. A motion was made by Robinil Jameson to spend up to \$250 dollars on a membership gift. The motion was seconded by Katy Cave and passed. Robinil has suggested a small black notebook with gold logo as the gift. There are three new membership packets to be completed. Robinil Jameson and Committee Chair Lynn Keeling will get together for the exchanging of information and assembling the membership packets.

Program: Cassidy Connell, Chair, asked questions, as she is preparing for the events of the year. The group agreed that the seminar should be around the second week in May, after Derby. We want to avoid April 18-20, because the Southern Regional IPMA meeting is in Louisville which represents 11 states.

There was a discussion of adding a third line to the conference registration form for conference registration and membership dues. The board discussed a \$500 cap on gifts for the conference. The History Center was the choice of the group for the May seminar. Ideas for speaker were discussed and a list was started. Cassidy Connell will send a list of theme ideas to the board for ideas or selection.

The July summer meeting was discussed too. Ande Godsey will be the contact at DOCJT for reserving a room, which will determine the date.

Finance Committee: Chair, Gregory Giesler, had no report.

Publications and Publicity Committee: Robinil did announce that the Governor's office will be glad to send out the seminar information this year. Cassidy is to get the information to Robinil as soon as possible. KSCPM had an article in the AACPM Newsletter.

Awards: No report

KSCPM Seminar

Society members attended an all day session held at the Kentucky History Center in Frankfort, Kentucky, on May 11. The theme of the seminar was "Making a Positive Difference During Adverse Times." Attendee survey responses were favorable for all five of our guest speakers with such comments as: 'Very useful information', 'Good rapport with audience', 'Truly enjoyable', 'Did better job than expected'. More than one overall comment said that it was by far the best seminar to date. Did you attend?

If you didn't, you missed out on Al Cornish's 'semi-fabulous' prizes. Al is the System Vice President Learning & Organizational Development/Chief Learning Officer with Norton Healthcare. He started the morning off with an exercise to engage minds. Attendees also participated in two brainstorming exercises, the results can be found on the KSCPM webpage.

Other speakers included, Colmon Elridge, Executive Assistant to the Governor, who explored the seminar theme and advised managers to encourage risks, set priorities in difficult times and simplify. Mr. Elridge presented President Jennifer Woods a proclamation issued by Governor Steven L. Beshear, designating Tuesday, May 11, 2011 as Kentucky Certified Public Managers® Day in celebration of the accomplishments of all state employees who have achieved this prestigious designation, and to encourage all agencies of the Commonwealth to continue their participation in the Kentucky Certified Public Managers® Program.

Representative Rick Rand, Chairman of the House Appropriations and Revenue Committee shared his experiences in building and managing relationships with the legislative leadership team. He also pointed out that Kentucky has managed to maintain its level of services in comparison to other states.

After a delicious buffet lunch, attendees had time to tour the exhibits at the History Center or visit the various booths in the resource area, before the next session began. Always a seminar favorite, KSCPM member and GSC instructor, Katy Cave, began the afternoon session with an outdoor exercise, designed to explore the role of trust in adverse times. The final speaker of the day Dr. William H. Crouch Jr., President of Georgetown College, talked to the group about the word 'making' in the seminar title being an action word that makes an impact. He said, "You may be the only person during difficult times with the skills to make a positive difference and must step up."
